SAN DIEGO BAY CRUISE

One of the highlights of the 47.5 Reunion was an evening dinner cruise on San Diego Bay aboard a



Hornblower Cruise Company boat. For Reunion 57 we plan to do it again, but this time there will be a three hour luncheon cruise. It will be a lot easier to see the sights of San Diego during the daylight rather than at night. Using their boat Adventure, we will board at the Coronado Island Marriott Resort pier, cruise under the San Diego-Coronado Bay Bridge, pass by the Navy ships at Naval Station San Diego, then past the USS Midway and out toward the entrance to the Bay. All the while there will be a delicious buffet to enjoy as well as your favorite beverages. The boat will then debark us at the Marriott pier.

USS MIDWAY TOUR

Exhibits range from the crew's sleeping quarters to a massive galley, engine room, the ship's brig, officer's country, machine shops, and pilots' ready rooms, as well as primary flight control and the bridge high in the island over the flight deck. Especially popular are the museum docents you'll meet throughout the ship. Each is eager to share a personal story, an anecdote, or amazing statistic, adding to your amazement throughout your adventure.

A Brief History of Coronado! *

A TOWN STEEPED IN HISTORY.

Coronado was named for the Coronado Islands off the coast of San Diego. They were first sighted on November 8, 1602 by the Spanish navigator Vizcaino. He named them "Los Coronados" or "the crowned ones" for four martyred saints of ancient Rome whose death had been on that day.

Once a flat, treeless landmass in the middle of the bay separating San Diego from the Pacific Ocean, Coronado attracted indigenous people gathering food sources, fishing and hunting jackrabbits and quail. But things changed in 1886 when visionary investors from the Midwest saw the potential of the scrubby "island". Elisha Babcock and Hampton Story began building a seaside resort com-

munity. Their syndicate held a land auction and eventually amassed a huge profit, which would be used to build a dream resort they hoped would be the "talk of the Western world" - the Del!!

THE HOTEL DEL CORONADO

The first official guests were re-

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ceived in 1888. Built entirely of wood and completed at a cost of \$1 Million, the Hotel Del Coronado is one of the last remaining Victorian seaside resorts, designed in the Queen Anne Revival style, with its whimsical turrets and asymmetrical design.

Tent City

In 1892, John D. Spreckels bought

out the original investors and, when times became bad, he established an alternative resort called Tent City down the Strand. Tent City appealed to the emerging middle class who could not afford the Del and flocked to the make-shift city of tents where they could enjoy bathing facilities, sailing, and other beachside activities. Tent City flourished until 1939.

North Island



North Island NAS

Spreckels sold "North Island" to the U.S. Government in 1917, and

since then the U.S. Army, Marines and now the Navy have made it home. North Island was the site for the first seaplane flight, the first midair refueling and the first non-stop transcontinental flight.

The Bridge

The relaxed Coronado way of life changed forever in 1969 when the bridge to San Diego opened and replaced the automobile ferries. In

1972 the first of the ten Coronado Shores Towers was completed, forever changing the skyline along the beach.

MUSEUM OF HISTORY AND ART *

Explore Coronado's fascinating past at the museum, with galleries



showcasing Coronado's early development, including the history of the Del and Tent City and the role of the military.

Spreckels Park

Centrally located in Coronado, Spreckels Park covers eight acres and features a playground, gazebo, and picnic tables. The central gazebo



bandstand is the site of the Coronado Summer Concert Series. The park is host to the Annual Flower Show, Art-in-the-Park and other community activities throughout the year. It was donated by and named after one of Coronado's city fathers J.D. Spreckels in 1927.

Coronado Ferry Landing *

Enjoy a wide selection of specialty shops, galleries and restaurants with fabulous views of downtown San Diego. There is also a bayfront bike path, sandy beach and fishing pier.



Catch the passenger ferry for the 20-minute ride across the bay to San Diego's waterfront attractions.

The Wizard of Oz **

The charming yellow house below is where L Frank Baum wrote several Oz books: Dorothy and the Wizard of Oz, The Emerald City of Oz, The



Road to Oz and parts of The Marvelous Land of Oz. From the sidewalk, you can spot the face of the Wicked Witch peering out from the side of the house.

BEACHES *

The Pacific Ocean meets the Coronado peninsula along a wide, flat beach with gentle, inviting surf. Consistently rated as one of the best beaches in the world for families, in 2012 this Coronado Beach was rated #1 in the United States. In the early morning you may see Navy SEALs working out and in the evening



watch spectacular sunsets as sailboats return and cruise ships depart San Diego Bay.

Shopping and Dining *

Once you arrive in Coronado you'll have plenty of opportunity for recreational shopping. The town has over 100 shops and boutiques scattered along Orange Avenue, at the Ferry Landing, and in the Hotel Del



Coronado. From jewelry to fashion to local art and Coronado souvenirs, you'll want to take home a reminder of your trip to the enchanted island. Your hardest decision will be where to eat, since Coronado has over 70 cafes and restaurants to choose from. You'll find fresh seafood, California cuisine and ethnic fare; many offer outdoor dining for you to enjoy Coronado's enviable weather.

Seeing the Attractions in the Crown City!

1. The Coronado Bridge: Visible from the Marriott Resort

2. The Ferry Landing: A short walk from the Marriott Resort

3. Orange Avenue sights: A trip by car, trolley or bus up from the Ferry Landing to the Hotel Del Coronado - offers views of Spreckels Park, the Coronado Museum of History and Art and many of the shops and restaurants along the Avenue. Once at the Del, you can also take in the fabulous Coronado Beach. 4. North Island NAS: U.S. Navy facilities are open to car and foot traffic with the proper ID.

5. The Hotel Del Coronado Tour: Volunteer docents from the Coronado Historical Association lead tours through the historic Hotel. Tours start at 10:30 AM on Tuesdays through Friday.

6. Coronado Heritage Walk: This promenade through the past departs from the lobby of the Museum of History and Art Wednesdays at 1030 hours. Learn about Coronado's famous buildings and residents.
